<p>Tomingley Gold Project reports and overview of activities: David Pritchard</p> <p>D. Pritchard spoke to each of the pages from a handout he had previously prepared for all. Comments made in addition to what was contained in the report were;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When speaking of the points under 'Community News' J. Hamilton stated the Dandaloo Church is within the community in which he lives and how thankful the community is for receiving the grant to assist with the community church's restoration. James went on to explain he kept himself separate from the application for funds as he did not wish there to be any perceived conflict, should the application have been successful. • T. Ellis asked about the mounds of dirt on the northern side of Kyalite Road. D. Pritchard explained the mounds of dirt are an amenity bund, all top soil, which will be revegetated. • D. Pritchard introduced Jeff Hall and explained he works for Constructive Solutions. J. Hall's role is to oversee the construction of the new highway on behalf of TGO. J. Hall gave a brief overview of himself, in particular his experience with bridge and road construction. J. Hall anticipates the highway construction to take 12 to 18 months, weather dependent. • T. Ellis enquired about the new fence line, wondering if this was for the highway diversion. D. Pritchard replied, when heading south, before McNivens LANE you will see on the right side there is a new bit of fence heading west, that's the western side of the highway alignment. • D. Pritchard spoke of the need to relocate the copper Telstra line, due to the highway realignment. This affected Max and Anne McNiven and one other customer on back Tomingley West Road. This will be completed by the end of May. • T. Clark asked is there any images of the proposed changes to the highway. She was wanting visual images of turning lanes and the over pass as a way of communicating to local residents how they will be affected. J. Hall replied design drawings are available and he will bring to the next meeting. T. Clark asked if this can be shown to the local residence. D. Pritchard said he will provide T. Clark with a photocopy of an aerial photo of what is being proposed later next week. D. Pritchard will also show local residents. • T. Ellis asked J. Hall how long the relocated section of highway will be. J. Hall replied 8.1km. J. Hall went on to explain he will also be certifying the construction of the other roads which lead up to the highway. These roads will be certified for the purpose of Narromine Shire council. When including these roads the total construction is 8.3km. 	<p>D. Pritchard provide aerial photo to T.
