<p>Tomingley Gold Project reports and overview of activities: David Pritchard</p> <p>D. Pritchard spoke to each of the pages from a handout he had previously prepared, along with the community newsletter. Comments made in addition to what was contained in the report were;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When speaking of the need to cull kangaroo numbers J. Hamilton asked who would be doing this. D. Pritchard explained there is a current employee of TGO who is also a professional shooter and he will be employed to reduce the population. • D. Pritchard explained he was in discussion with Lifeline Central West as part of their successful application for funding through the Tomingley Community Fund. Lifeline Central West is looking to put on an event in Narromine, targeted towards men’s mental health. J. Hamilton suggested they consider partnering with the League and Union football clubs as a way of attracting men to attend. • J. Hamilton asked if Jeff Hall will be on site daily once the construction of the highway begins. D. Pritchard said he will be to ensure Robson Construction (Robson Civil Projects) meet their contractual obligations and TGO also meet their contractual obligations with Transport NSW. 	
<p>Alkane-TGO CCC exploration update February 2025: Alex Cherry’s presentation</p> <p>A. Cherry spoke to each of the pages from his handout and the large maps of the mine site and surrounds which he had printed off and brought to the meeting.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At the completion of A. Cherry’s presentation J. Hamilton asked, are you happy, over all with your exploration work over the past twelve months? A. Cherry replied, I would have liked to have found more. I was disappointed with the air drilling results but my boss has taken a second look and is more encouraged than me. • T. Ellis asked how deep are you drilling. A. Cherry replied, the deepest one was 360 metres and the shallowest was about 200 metres.
